# REQUEST FROM DIRECTOR SWISHER FOR THE BOARD TO RECONSIDER THE MOTION PASSED AT JUNE 16, 2021 MEETING REGARDING WATER SERVICE PRIORITY FOR PARCEL 514-041-014

The meeting minutes show the following motion as approved:

"Verick moved for the District to write a letter to Kostrzewa stating that if she built a dwelling on the original parcel, APN 514-041-014, and in the event the State of CA allows the District to add water shares the dwelling would qualify her for a water share if she is able to demonstrate need and also to update the 401 listing with the current and correct APN # for that parcel. Seconded by Llanos; approved, four ayes, one abstain (Hankin)."

In the days following the meeting the Water Service Priorities Subcommittee members (Hankin, Swisher and Rosenblatt) agreed that I would write the letter to Kostrzewa. As I began to think about the letter something jogged my memory, and I suddenly felt certain that the District regulations prohibit any changes to assignment of water service priorities without the passage of a resolution or an ordinance. I went to the office and easily found Resolution 95-5, which is reproduced below and which clearly shows that the action we had taken at the June 16 meeting was in apparent violation of this Resolution. Due to this apparent violation I wish to request the Board's reconsideration of the motion passed at the June 16 meeting.

#### RESOLUTION 95-5 ASSIGNS PARCELS AND DWELLINGS TO PRIORITY CATEGORIES FOR PROVIDING WATER SERVICE

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Westhaven Community Services District established priority categories for providing water service to the District residents with Ordinance 88-2, 90-1 and 95-4; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 95-4 establishes a category (Section 501) for parcels provided with water service after December 31, 1987; and

WHEREAS, purchase of the 4th Avenue Well by the WCSD has provided additional water source; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Avenue Well Purchase Agreement required the provision of water service to three parcels in Section 403 of Ordinance 90-1; and

WHEREAS, fulfillment of the conditions of a Community Development Block Grant, which funded major improvements to the WCSD distribution system, required the provision of water service to eighteen parcels in Section 401 of Ordinance 90-1; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Directors of the Westhaven Community Services District assigns to categories corresponding to Sections 301, 401, 402, 403 and 501 of Ordinance 95-4, the attached list of parcel numbers, the list including the number of dwellings to be provided water service in Sections 301, 401, 402, and 501; and

# BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, changes to the attached list which reflect provision of additional water services shall not be made unless accompanied by supporting Ordinance and/or Resolution of the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, updated versions of the attached list which reflect changes in parcel information such as change in ownership or parcel number (due to lot divisions or combinations, etc.) shall be annotated as such and retained in a file which includes the attached list and all updated versions.

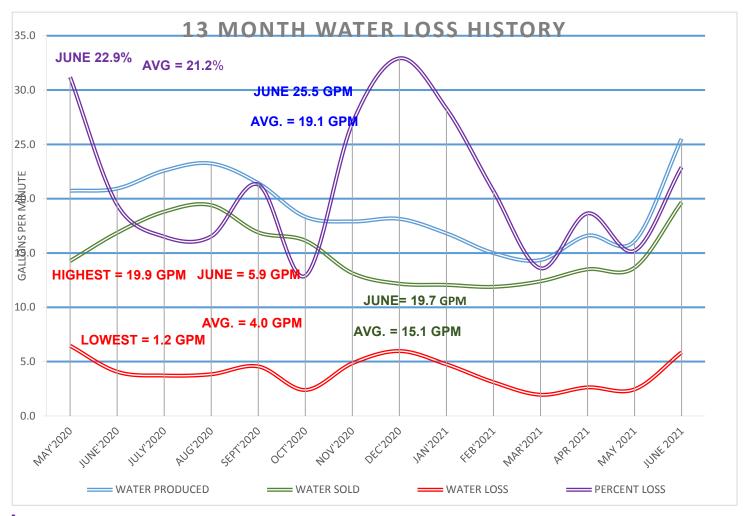

## ORDINANCE RE USE OF DISTRICT PROPERTY FOR RECREATION 2021-2 WESTHAVEN COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT ("WCSD")

## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING USE OF WCSD PROPERTY FOR RECREATION

Be it ordained by the Board of Directors of the Westhaven Community Services District, Humboldt County, California, as follows:

## **ARTICLE 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Section 101 <u>Short Title</u>: This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as "PUBLIC USE OF WCSD PROPERTY FOR RECREATION."

Section 102 <u>Words and Phrases</u>: For the purpose of this Ordinance, all words used herein in the present tense shall include the future; all words in the plural number shall include the singular number; and all words in the singular number shall include the plural.

Section 103 Effect of Definition: The definition of a word applies to any of its variants.

Section 104 <u>Severability</u>: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

## **ARTICLE 2 DEFINITIONS**

Section 201 <u>Recreation</u> includes any use of WCSD ("District") property by any member of the general public, where that use does not concern official WCSD business.

## **ARTICLE 3 POLICY**

Section 301 <u>Prohibition on Dogs</u>: Dogs are prohibited WCSD property unless on a leash or under the verbal control of the person accompanying it.

Section 302 <u>Presence of Dogs as Trespass</u>: The presence of a dog on WCSD property that is not on a leash or under the verbal control of the person accompanying it constitutes a trespass.

Section 303 <u>Termination of Unsafe Behavior</u>: In the event any person and/or any animal accompanying a person is, or has been, on WCSD property and has engaged in behavior that any WCSD staff member believes to be unsafe, whether that behavior was believed to be: (a) unsafe to the person who exhibited that behavior; (b) unsafe to other people; or a danger to the District's property or operations, any WCSD staff member is authorized order the person and/or animal to vacate WCSD property. Any WCSD staff member is further authorized to ban any person and/or any person's animal that has engaged in behavior the staff member believed to be unsafe to people or a danger to property or operations from any further recreational use of WCSD property.

Section 304 <u>Failure to Comply is a Trespass</u>: Any person who does not comply with an order by a WCSD staff member to vacate WCSD property, or who violates a ban on further recreational use of WCSD property, has committed a trespass.

Section 305 <u>Abatement of Trespass</u>: The WCSD General Manager and Staff are authorized to contact relevant law enforcement agencies to obtain assistance in abating any ongoing trespass on WCSD property. Upon receiving further authorization from the WCSD Board, the WCSD General Manager may take necessary further legal action to enjoin, or to obtain monetary redress for, any trespass on WCSD Property.
